As a Director of Touchmark, Bruce works with other leaders to guide the company's development, construction, and overall management. Representing THPRD, he served as a member of the Washington County Senate Bill 122 Citizen Advisory Committee, which gave recommendations for defining future essential services and city boundaries. Bruce also served as Chairman of the Tualatin Hills Park Foundation. In addition, Bruce served in various roles for Washington County: He was a member of the Land Use Advisory Committee and was appointed to the Washington County Planning Commission.

In 2006, Bruce resigned his elected position with THPRD and his appointed Washington County Planning Commission position to accept an appointment as Councilor with the city of Beaverton. At the November 2006 general election, Bruce was elected to a four-year term to this same city council position.

A graduate of Portland State University, Bruce holds a Bachelor of Science in Biology, a Certificate in Public Health Studies and Administration as well as minor studies in Business Administration. He also holds an Associate of Science degree and an Associate of Arts degree from Portland Community College.
